EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

WELCOME TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Colorado's efforts to improve systems of care and enhance patient interactions with physicians in all specialties recently got a boost when the American College of Physicians (ACP) published a policy paper on medical neighborhoods.

The policy paper – like the Colorado Systems of Care/Patient-centered Medical Home Initiative – recognizes that health system reform requires more than just primary care redesign. The paper details ways to improve care coordination and integration between primary care patient-centered medical homes, subspecialist physicians and other health care professionals. The pioneering work of the Colorado SOC/ PCMH Initiative is cited in the paper.

American College of Physicians President J. Fred Ralston, Jr., MD, says: "For a PCMH to be functioning properly, it must have an effective relationship with specialty/subspecialty physicians, hospitals, pharmacists, care managers, and others; making these 'neighboring' physicians and other health care providers of the utmost importance to patient care."

More than Home

In 2007, ACP joined three other major primary care specialty societies (AAFP, AOA and AAP) to create the Joint Principles of the Patient-Centered Medical Home (PCMH). The principles helped to solidify the model and, as a result, propelled a sweeping set of pilots and other PCMH initiatives across the nation in a push to ensure that patients receive "the right care, at the right time, in the right place."

This fall, ACP took the next step and released *The Patient-Centered Medical Home Neighbor – The Interface of the Medical Home with Specialty/Subspecialty Practices*. The paper was co-authored by Grand Junction endocrinologist Carol Greenlee, MD.

The Patient-Centered Medical Home Neighbor paper is the result of three years of work by ACP's Council of Subspecialty Societies to explore and define the relationship between the PCMH and specialty/subspecialty practices. The paper delineates the roles, definitions and function of this new relationship and offers recommendations on care coordination agreements, incentives for and recognition of the Patient-Centered Medical Home-Neighbor (PCMH-N). Colorado has a head start on much of this work, thanks to the efforts of the SOC/PCMH initiative over the past year and a half. The SOC/PCMH Initiative has built awareness not only about PCMH, but also about the need to link medical homes to broader systems of care including specialty physicians within a medical neighborhood

ACP defines the PCMH-N as a specialty/subspecialty medical practice that:

- Ensures effective communication, coordination, and integration with PCMH practices in a bidirectional manner to provide high-quality and efficient care;
- Ensures appropriate and timely consultations and referrals that complement the aims of the PCMH practice;
- Ensures the efficient, appropriate, and effective flow of necessary patient and care information;
- Effectively guides determination of responsibility in co-management situations;
- Supports patient-centered care, enhanced care access and high levels of care quality and safety;
- Supports the PCMH practice as the provider of whole person primary care to the patient and as having overall responsibility for ensuring the coordination and integration of the care provided by all involved physicians and other health care

professionals to link medical homes to broader systems of care including specialty physicians within a medical neighborhood.

Defining the neighborhood

Ralston notes that from the patient's perspective, a PCMH practice serves as the central hub of health care information, providing primary care and care coordination across the delivery system.

Connecting that home to larger systems of care is critical as the PCMH model grows and is more widely adopted. The paper recognizes and emphasizes the important role that specialists and subspecialists play within the PCMH model by specifying the roles of a PCMH neighbor (PCMH-N). ACP defines the PCMH-N as a specialist/subspecialist that collaborates with a PCMH to communicate the appropriate, timely and effective bi-directional flow of patient information, and participates in the care team to ensure accountability for care transitions and shared decision making in order to provide high quality, patient-centered care.

The principles of a care coordination agreement between specialist and primary care physician are also outlined in the paper. Sometimes known as a "**compact**," this agreement is necessary in order to define the relationship and ensure mutual accountability including:

- Specifying the content of the patient transition record;
- Recognizing patient/family preferences;
- Determining how secondary referrals are handled;
- Addressing situations of self-referral and emergencies;
- Clarifying in-patient processes;
- Containing a mechanism for regular review of the agreement and periodic evaluation of each other's cooperation.

The SOC/PCMH Initiative has been leading the way by developing a care compact that works. I have been using it in my Westminster practice for nearly a year. The compact has strengthened my relationships with my specialist medical neighbors and improved patient care and safety.

Dr. Cooperman reported on the AOA Board of Trustees meeting that took place in February:

- The AOA continues to work with the Texas Osteopathic Medical Association to fight against the addition of a MD program at the Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine;
- The AOA Clinical Assessment Program (CAP) has received recognition by the CMS as an approved Quality Assurance program. DO's can earn a 2% bonus payment from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services Physician Quality Reporting Initiative (PQRI) by participating in the CAP program;
- The AOA has endorsed the software developed by Health Fusion as the Electronic Health Record program of choice;
- The Washington office has outgrown its office space and the AOA has leased new space that will double the size of the advocacy office. The space is being paid with the money donated to the AOA Greatness Campaign;
- The Red Flag Program that would have forced physicians to act as creditors and informed patients of certain credit criteria has been delayed indefinitely;
- It was announced that Ray Stowers, DO will be nominated to be the AOA President Elect at the House of Delegates meeting in July, 2011.
- The reorganization of the House of Delegates is underway. Procedural requirements will cause this to take two years to complete. The Greatness Fund will permanently close and the funds will be used to establish a National Osteopathic Advocacy Center in DC.

COLORADO SPRINGS OSTEOPATHIC FOUNDATION

At the last meeting of the Colorado Springs Osteopathic Foundation's board, the board voted to amend the Foundation's bylaws to officially grant Osteopathic Medical Students, Foundation membership upon application and approval of the board. MEET THE CSOM TRUSTEES



Bruce Dubin, DO, JD

Dr. Dubin was former Interim Dean, Vice Dean for Medical Education and Associate Professor of Internal Medicine at the Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine (TCOM). He received his osteopathic medicine training at the Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine and received a law degree *cum laude* from the University of Detroit College of Law. He completed an internal medicine residency program at Martin Place Hospital in Madison Heights, Michigan and a fellowship program in Allergy and Clinical Immunology at the National Jewish Hospital/University of Colorado Medical Center. Dr. Dubin was a former Associate Dean and Professor of Internal Medicine at the Edward Via Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine, and

also served as Associate Dean and Associate Professor of Health Policy and Medical Jurisprudence at Ohio University College of Osteopathic Medicine. He was Vice President of Medical Education at Grandview Hospital and Medical Center in Dayton, Ohio. In 2007, Dr. Dubin was named Osteopathic Medical Educator of the American Osteopathic Association. He has been the principal investigator in a number of research grants and is widely published. Dr. Dubin is licensed to practice osteopathic medicine in Texas and Michigan and is certified by the American Osteopathic Board of Internal Medicine. He is admitted to practice law in the state of Michigan.

Doctor Bacon is a Past President of CSOM and has been on the Board of Trustees since 2004-05. He has practiced Rural Medicine since 1998 and is on staff at Banner Health System in Sterling, CO. Doctor Bacon received his DO Degree from Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine (KCOM) and then completed a Family Practice residency at the Park Lane Medical Center at the Kansas City University of Medicine and Biosciences, College of Osteopathic Medicine (KCUMB-COM). He was Chief Resident from 1997-1998. He is a Preceptor for the Colorado Osteopathic Education Center (COEC), and is an Assistant Professor for KCOM. Doctor Bacon volunteers for the Sterling Fire Department as their Medical Director.

Two students from Rocky Vista University College of Osteopathic Medicine, Alexis Michopoulos OMS-3 and Aaron Craig OMS-3, shared their rotation experiences in Colorado Springs and why they chose medicine as a career. It was encouraging that the students conveyed that they are receiving what they need from their clinical rotations and preceptors, and that excellent communication between the preceptors and students plays a critical role in that occurring. Dr. Louis Kasunic provided a most thought provoking presentation on Cardiovascular Risk Reduction. Two recipients of CSOF grants presented information on their organizations and how our grants help them provide services. C. S. Therapeutic Riding Center was able to provide free or reduced rate occupational/hippo-therapy to over 50 children. Their goal is to provide therapy to 100 children this year and double their staff. TLC Pharmacy opened in January 2010 and has provided 3,300 prescriptions to over 800 patients who could not afford to purchase their medications.

The next Board of Directors meeting is scheduled for April 21st at the Foundation's office. An annual membership meeting will be scheduled for June.

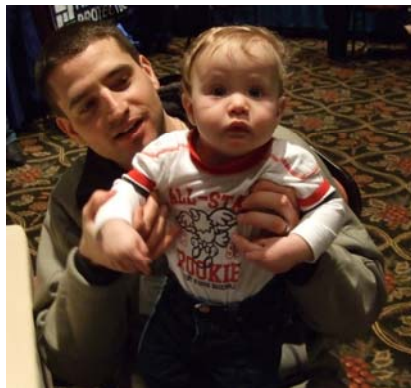

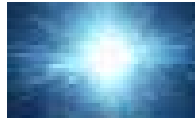
